Philippians 4:10, 14 ^{NIV}

I rejoiced greatly in the Lord that at last you **renewed your concern** for me. Indeed, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it.

¹⁴ Yet it was good of you **to share in my troubles.**

Contentment is learned through circumstances

Philippians 4:11-12 ^{NIV}

I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have **learned to be content whatever the circumstances.** ¹² I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. Philippians 4:11-12 ^{NIV}

Generosity is an eternal practice

Philippians 4:15-17 ^{NIV}

Moreover, as you Philippians know, in the early days of your acquaintance with the gospel, when I set out from Macedonia, not one church shared with me in **the matter of giving and receiving**, except you only; ¹⁶ for even when I was in Thessalonica, **you sent me aid more than once** when I was in need. ¹⁷ Not that I desire your gifts; what I desire is that **more be credited to your account.**

Generosity is a practice of worship

Philippians 4:18 ^{NIV}

I have received full payment and have more than enough. I am amply supplied, now that I have received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent. They are a fragrant offering, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God.
