The Confession of King David



2 Samuel 11:2-5 niv

One evening David got up from his bed and walked around on the roof of the palace. From the roof he saw a woman bathing. The woman was very beautiful, ³ and David sent someone to find out about her. The man said, "She is Bathsheba, the daughter of Eliam and the wife of Uriah the Hittite." ⁴ Then David sent messengers to get her. She came to him, and he slept with her. Then she went back home. ⁵ The woman conceived and sent word to David, saying, "I am pregnant."

Psalm 32:1-5 niv guilt of my sin.

Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.² Blessed is the one whose sin the LORD does not count against them and in whose spirit is no deceit.³ When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. ⁴ For day and night your hand was heavy on me; my strength was sapped as in the heat of summer. ⁵ Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity.
