Psalm 105:1-9 NIV

Give praise to the LORD, proclaim his name;

he has done.

² Sing to him, sing praise to him;
tell of all his wonderful acts.

and observe his laws.

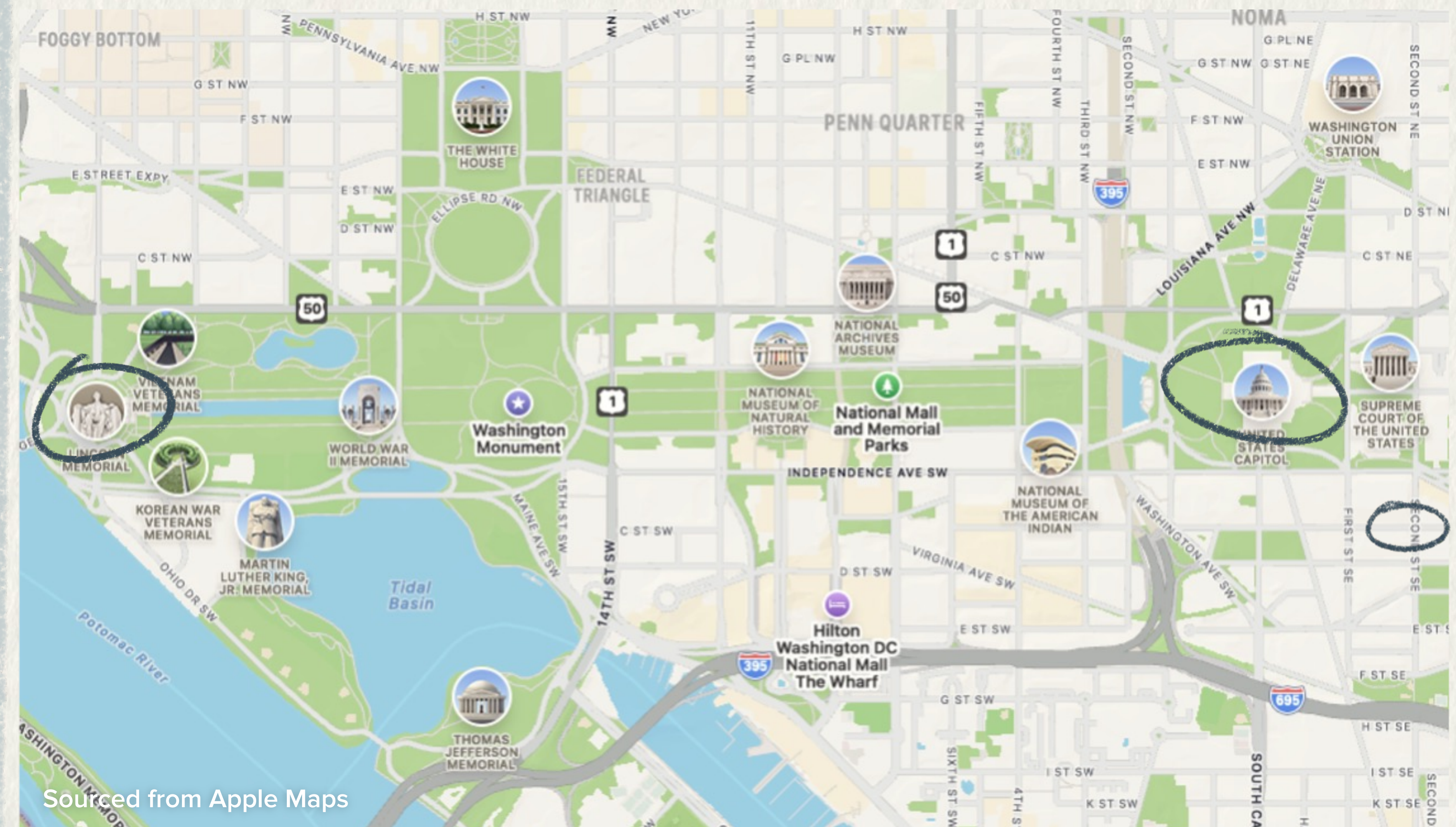

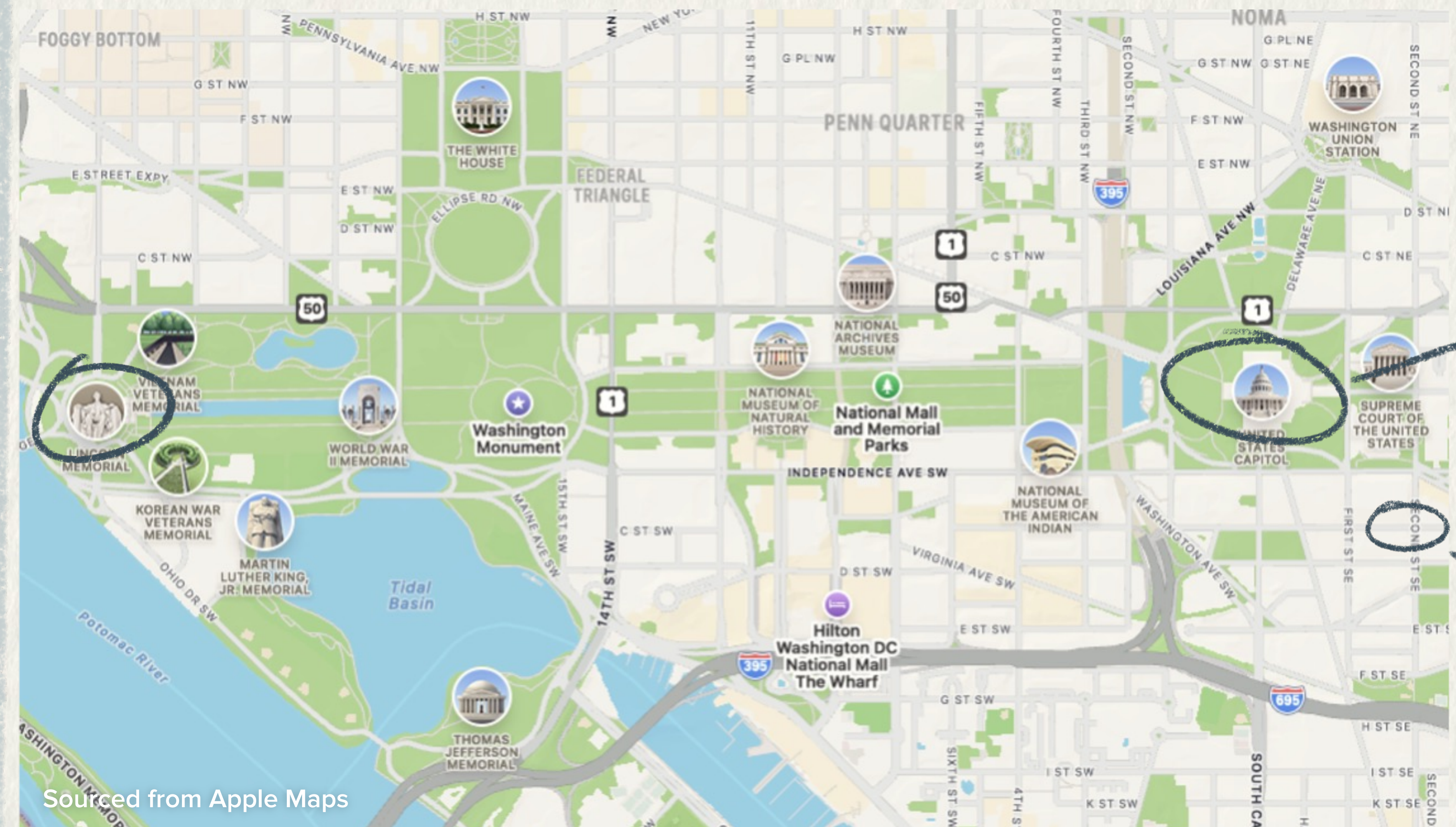


