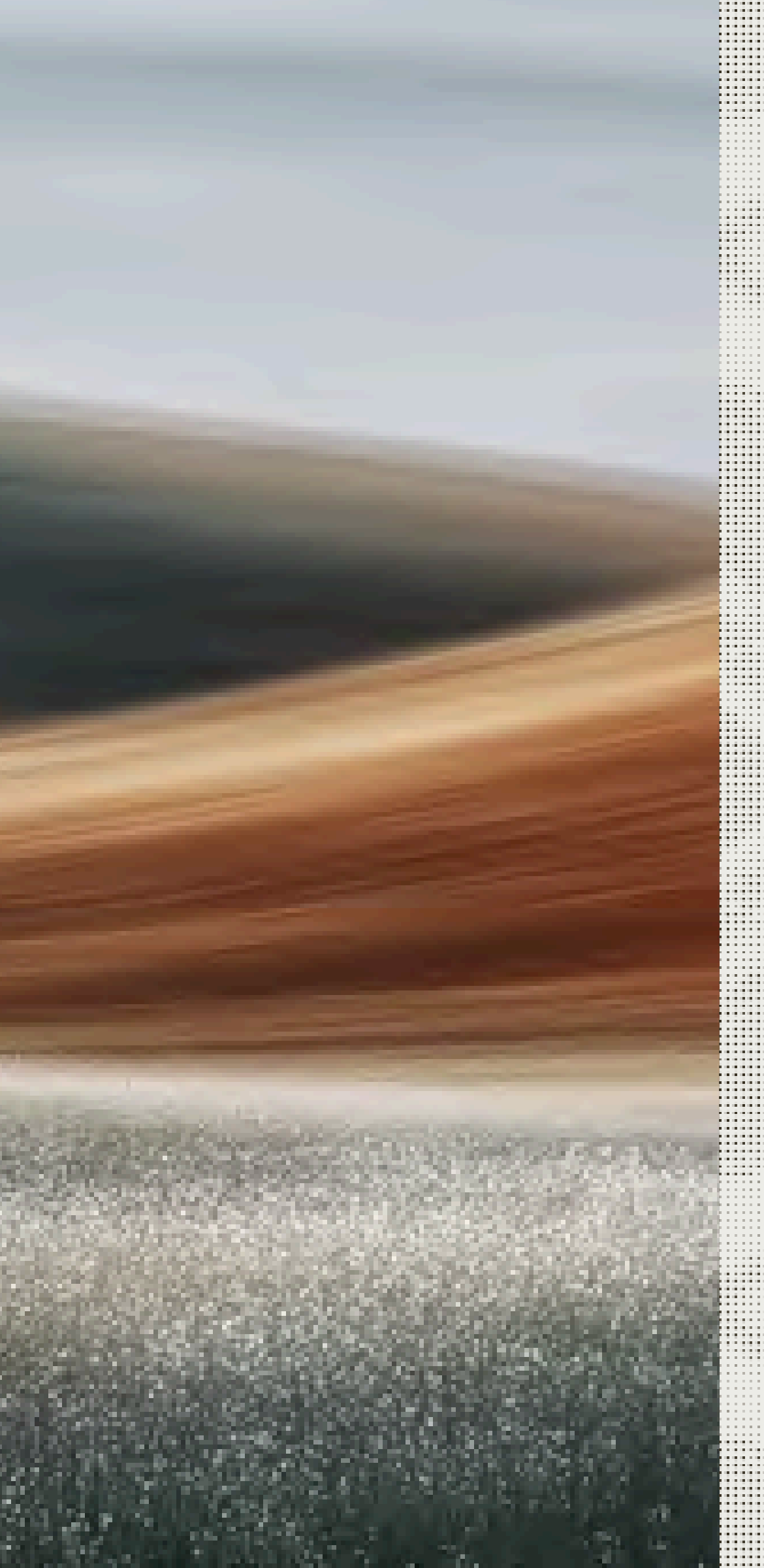

## PRETENSE

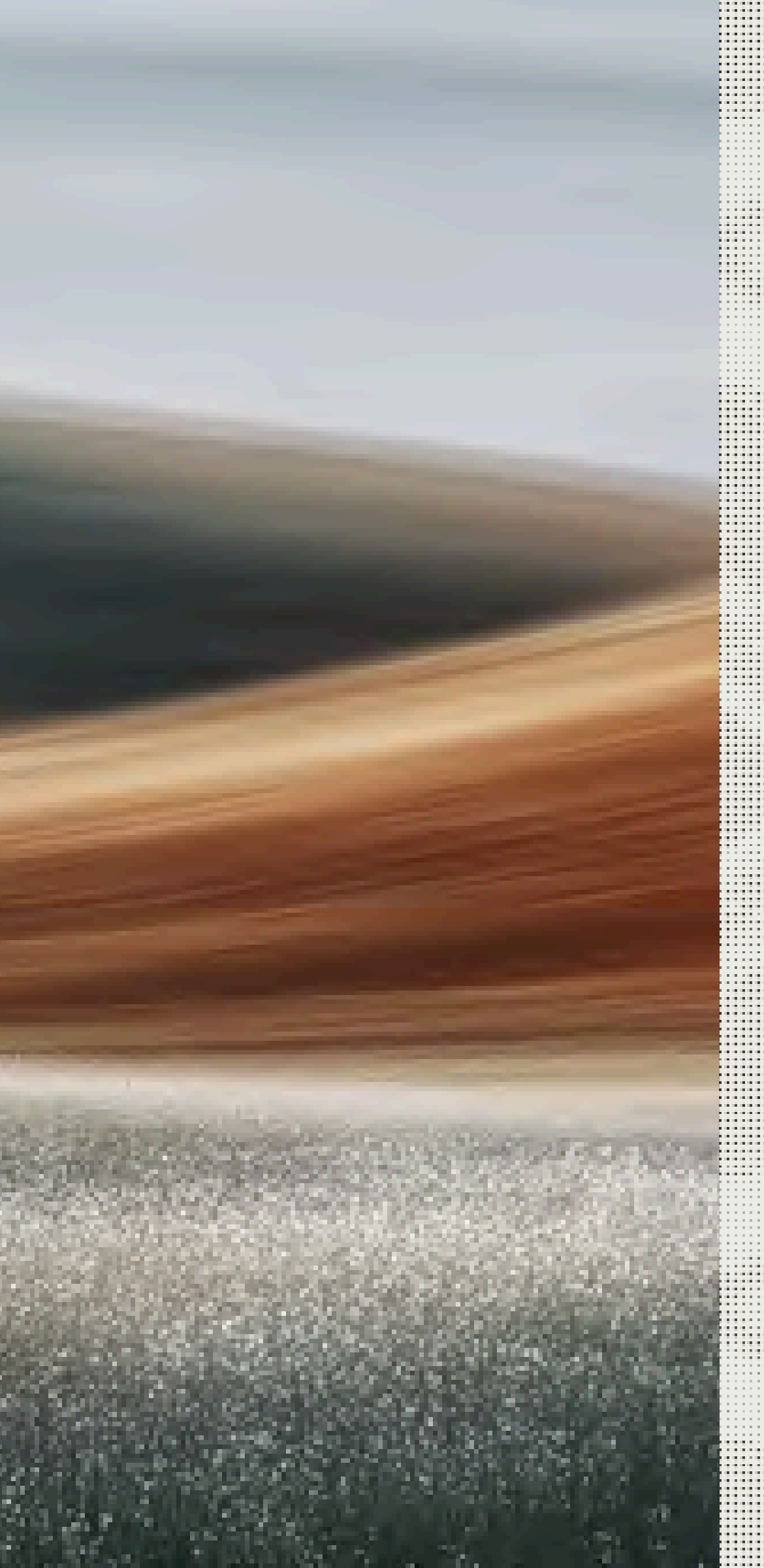
1. An attempt to make something that is not the case appear true.

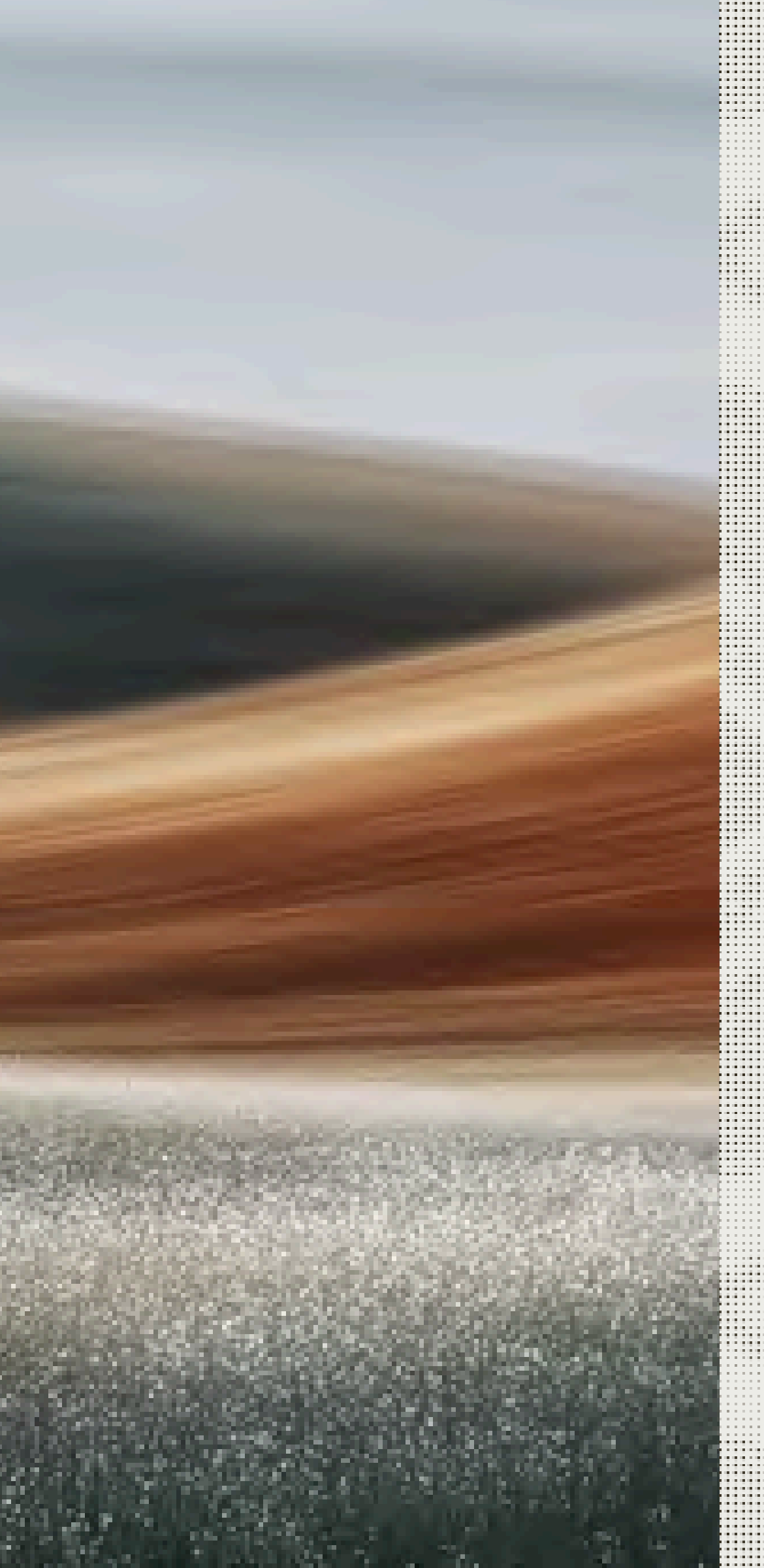
And **God's grace** was so powerfully at work in them all<sup>34</sup> that there were no needy persons among them.
