

Discipleship in Your Home Tip Sheet

Tip #1: Pray without Ceasing.

¹⁷ pray continually 1 Thessalonians 5.17

Tip #2: Know the Goal of Parenting.

To Win, Coach, then Release the hearts of your children into a world that stands in need of their leadership.

Tip #3: Coach Well.

The Shema is the central prayer in the Jewish prayer book and is often the first section of Scripture that a Jewish child learns. Comprised of three passages, it begins with the text below.

Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and your gates. Deut. 6.4-9 (NIV)

It is traditional for Jews to say the Shema as their last words of the day, and for parents to teach their children to say it before they go to sleep at night. The first verse captures the monotheistic essence of Judaism, following by the greatest commandment. Found within this prayer is a call to coach/disciple our children.

<u>Impress</u> (shannan): to point, to sharpen (swords & arrows), teach diligently, incisively with bite!

Tip #4:

Parent Redemptively.

Now brothers, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you ... For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures that he was buried that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures and that he appeared ... 1 Corinthians 15.1-5 (NIV)


2. Understand the Effects of The Fall on Your Family.

We follow this sequence in Scripture: The First Adam received life, the Last Adam is a life-giving Spirit. Physical life comes first, then spiritual—a firm base shaped from the earth, a final completion coming out of heaven. The First Man was made out of earth, and people since then are earthy; the Second Man was made out of heaven, and people now can be heavenly. In the same way that we've worked from our earthy origins, let's embrace our heavenly ends. 1 Corinthians 15.45-49 (MSG)


