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## Live as One

"Guilty?" or "Not Guilty?"—The key questions asked in a TRIAL.

"Who am I?" and "What is my role in this world?"—The key questions we ask ourselves.

These were the questions asked of Jesus during His "trials." How do YOU answer these questions for yourself? Compare yourself to the key players in this passage.

## Live by the Word

**Read Luke 22:66-23:25; II Corinthians 5:17 and 21.**

Note the different trials: Jewish and Roman.

What were the motivations of each of the key player-groups?

Jewish Sanhedrin (religious leaders)—  
Luke 22:66-71, 23:13-18, 21-23; Matthew 26:57-68, 27:20; Mark 14:63-65, 15:11

Jewish crowd—Luke 23:13-18, 21-23, 26; Matthew 27:25-26; Mark 15:12-14

Pilate—Luke 23:1-7, 13-25; Matthew 27:11-24; Mark 15:2-15; John 18:29-19:16

Herod—Luke 23:7-11
